2025 FLORIDA PTA LEGISLATIVE ACTION PRIORITIES

Parental Rights

- **Parent Information:** Provide clear, comparable data on student and school performance.
- **Early Evaluations:** Inform parents of their right to request learning disability screenings.
- **Caregiver Education:** Empower families with knowledge about healthy screen time habits and the prevention of exposure to violence and exploitation of all forms.

Safety

- **Data Privacy:** Strengthen protections for student information.
- **Safe Campuses:** Continue to prioritize funding for school safety.



• Funding

- Funding for Schools: Increase Base Student Allocation by at least 5% and provide additional flexibility for school districts.
- **Capital Needs:** Allocate funds based on school site needs.
- Education Workforce: Advocate for competitive salaries to attract and retain top-quality education staff, driving student success and economic growth.

Attendance

• Chronic Absenteeism: Define chronic absenteeism and allow school districts to initiate intervention programs sooner.

Child Welfare

- Access to Care: Ensure families have affordable health care and essential resources.
- Affordable Childcare: Provide high-quality childcare and a full day PreK program.
- **Basic Needs:** Address housing & employment needs for families.
- Diversify Graduation Pathways: Continue support for ELL, ESE and CTE pathways to graduation and transition programs.
- Mental Health Support: Increase the mental health allocation and allow school districts flexibility in spending.
